Advanced Theory & O.S.C.E. Preparation (IAM) – In-person

Students undertake a thorough presentation and participation towards being prepared for the CMTO (OSCE) hands-on examination for future registration to become an RMT. In addition to the class sessions there is mock oral practical (schedule is TBA).

(2 credits) Pre-requisite: Complete/Massage Therapy Semesters 1-5

Mondays 1:15pm – 5:15pm January 4 to March 15

Anatomy 5 (IAM/TCM/NHP) - Online

Anatomy 5 or Osteology is the study of the science of the structure and function of bone. This course takes an in-depth look into the human skeleton concentrating on the bones and bony landmarks of the body.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Anatomy/Physiology 4

Thursdays 8:30am - 10:30am

January 7 to March 18

Anatomy 8 (IAM/NHP/CEU) - Online

This course discusses the digestive system and accessory organs of digestion in the human body. The urinary and reproductive systems will also be discussed. The end of the course provides an introduction to the nervous system.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Anatomy 7 **Wednesdays** 3:15pm – 5:15pm

January 6 to March 17

Anatomy 8 (TCM/NHP/CEU) - Online

This course discusses the digestive system and accessory organs of digestion in the human body. The urinary and reproductive systems will also be discussed. The end of the course provides an introduction to the nervous system.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Anatomy 7 **Thursdays** 6:00pm – 8:00pm January 7 to March 18

Courses - - Winter 2021 (January 3 – March 19)

Aromatherapy 1 (NHP/CEU) - Online

The use of essential oils for relaxation, beauty and health. Learn several hands-on applications.

(1 credit) No Pre-requisite

Mondays 6:00pm – 9:00pm

January 25 to March 15

Client Assessment Lab 1 (IAM) - In-person

This assessment course will introduce the student to clinical assessment techniques such as taking case histories, and interviewing clients. Other topics discussed are assessing client pain, assessment responses and end-feels during physical examination. The student will also learn how

to assess gait and posture. Basic kinesiology is also included. The student will also be assessing the lower extremity using ROM, orthopedic and neurological tests.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Client Assessment 1

Fridays 3:15pm – 5:15pm January 8 to March 19

Client Assessment Lab 2 (IAM) – In-person

This assessment course will introduce the student to clinical assessment techniques such as taking case histories, interviewing clients and the interview process. The student will be assessing the upper extremity and back using ROM, orthopedic and neurological tests.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Client Assessment 6

Tuesdays 8:30am – 12:30pm February 16 to March 16

Client Assessment 2 - 3 (IAM) - Online

This course is the beginning of regional assessment of the body, starting with the lower limb.

(2 credits) Pre-requisites: Client Assessment 1, Anatomy/Physiology 4

Mondays 1:15pm - 3:15pm & Tuesdays 8:30am - 10:30am

January 4 to March 16

Client Assessment 6 (IAM) - Online

This is a continuation of client assessments focusing on the joints of the upper extremity.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Client Assessment 4/5

Tuesdays 8:30am – 12:30pm

January 5 to February 9

Ethics & the Healthcare Practitioner (IAM/TCM/NHP/CEU) - Online

The focus is on developing the student's ability to understand the role of a professional and the necessary commitment, by recognizing ethical issues encountered in their role, distinguishing between legal and ethical responsibilities, meeting the professional and ethical requirements of client care and personal conduct, and to develop a step by step skill in helping to make ethical decisions.

(1/2 credit) No pre-requisite

First Aid and CPR (IAM) - In-person

(Space limited to max 9 students) (1 credit) No pre-requisite **Sundays** 8:30am-5:15pm January 17 & 31

Herbalism 1a (NHP/CEU) - Online

Growing and harvesting herbs in your everyday life. Medicinal herb focus.

(1 credit) No pre-requisite.

Wednesdays 6:00pm - 8:00pm

January 6 to March 17

Iridology 1 (NHP/CEU) – Online

Learn the foundational principles of Iridology and its use as an assessment aid for natural health practitioners. (1 credit) No Pre-requisite (Textbook required)

Wednesdays 6:00pm - 8:00pm

January 13 to March 3

Meridian Theory 1 (TCM) - Online

The course presents an insight into this fascinating system of Chinese medicine, which encompasses the important concept of Yin/Yang to the presence of illness or wellness, and the need to balance both.

(1 credit) No Pre-requisite

Tuesdays 6:00pm - 8:00pm

January 5 to March 16

Meridian Theory 2 (TCM) - Online

This course reviews the 12 regular meridians and the 8 extraordinary meridians, provides detailed descriptions of the 12 divergent channels, the 15 collaterals, the 12 muscular regions and the 12 cutaneous regions.

(1 Credit) Pre-requisite: Meridian Theory 1

Thursdays 10:30am - 12:30pm

January 7 to March 18

Myology 1 (IAM/NHP/CEU) - Online

This course is an in-depth study of the muscles of the lower extremity, hip, leg, foot, gluteal region and anterior thorax. It discusses the origin, insertion, action and nerve supply of the muscles that move the lower limb.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Anatomy/Physiology 4

Thursdays 1:15pm – 3:15pm

January 7 to March 18

Myology 1 (TCM/NHP/CEU) - Online

A study of the relationship between the muscles and acupuncture points of the body.

(1 Credit) Pre-requisite: Meridian Theory 1

Tuesdays 10:30am - 12:30pm

January 5 to March 16

Courses - - Winter 2021 (January 3 – March 19)

Myology 3 (IAM/CEU) - Online

This course is an in-depth study of the muscles of the head, face and neck. Origin, insertion, action and nerve supply of the muscles that move the head and face and neck are discussed.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Myology 2

Tuesdays 1:15pm – 3:15pm January 5 to March 16

Neuroscience 1 (IAM) - Online

Neuroscience 1 is an in-depth examination of the nervous system. The physiology of the central nervous system and peripheral nervous systems are broken down in a detailed analysis of structure and function. The special senses are also included during this course of study.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Anatomy/Physiology 1-4

Mondays 10:30am - 12:30pm

January 4 to March 15

Nutrition 1 (IAM) - Online

This course provides an understanding of nutritional concepts. The ability to communicate effectively with your clients or other healthcare practitioners about basic nutritional elements and considerations, as well as the macro and micro nutrients.

(0.5 credit) No pre-requisite

Thursdays 3:15pm – 5:15pm

January 7 to February 11

Off-Site / On-site Lab 1 - In-person

Students learn how to perform a 15-minute chair/table massage and how to network with the general public. Clients are fully dressed for this segment of training. They learn networking skills on how to communicate with the general public and encourage clients to come into student clinic for treatment.

(2 credits) Pre-requisites: Massage Techniques 1-4 & Client Assessment 1

Tuesdays 1:30pm – 4:00pm January 5 to March 16

Off-Site / On-site Lab 2 (IAM) – In-person

Massage therapy treatment is given to clients while fully supervised by a RMT. The student will learn how to transfer clients on/off the massage table. Students will learn how to treat the elderly, including all the ailments that can affect that population (dementia/Alzheimer's/osteoporosis, etc.)

(2 credits) Pre-requisites: Massage Techniques 1-4 & Anatomy/Physiology 1-4

Wednesdays 1:15pm - 5:15pm

January 6 to March 17

On-Site Clinical Case Study 1 (IAM) - In-person

Each massage therapy student assesses a client, develops a treatment plan and then applies the treatment plan to the same client weekly throughout the semester. Students learn how to prepare a detailed progress report.

(2 credits) Pre-requisite: Program Director Approval

Thursdays 1:15pm – 4:30pm

January 7 to March 18

Courses - - Winter 2021 (January 3 – March 19)

On-Site Clinical Case Study 2 (IAM) - In-person

Each senior massage therapy student assesses a client, develops a treatment plan and then applies the treatment plan to the same client weekly throughout the semester. Students then prepare a detailed progress report.

(2 credits) Pre-requisite: On-site Clinical Case Study 1

Tuesdays 1:15pm – 4:30pm January 5 to March 16

Oriental Acupressure and TuiNa 1 (TCM/NHP/CEU) - In-person

Students evolve a basic understanding of TuiNa techniques. The use of TuiNa to treat common pain-related ailments is also presented and discussed.

(1 credit) No pre-requisite.

Mondays 9:15am - 1:15pm

January 4 to February 1

Oriental Acupressure and TuiNa 2 (TCM/NHP/CEU) - In-person

Students learn to complete a full-body treatment, facial massage and self-massage using Tuina. It's principles as a TCM treatment modality are also presented and discussed.

(1 credit) No Pre-requisite

February 8 to March 15

Pathology 2 (IAM/TCM) - Online

Pathology 2 is an in-depth study of diseases of the skin.

(1 credit) Pre-requisites: Anatomy/Physiology 4 & Pathology 1

Mondays 8:30am - 10:30am & Thursdays 10:30am - 12:30pm

January 4 to February 4

Pathology 3 (IAM/TCM) - Online

Pathology 3 is an in-depth study of diseases of the joints and bones.

(1 credit) Pre-requisites: Anatomy/Physiology 4 & Pathology 1

Mondays 8:30am – 10:30am & Thursdays 10:30am – 12:30pm

February 8 to March 18

Pathology 7 (IAM/TCM) - Online

Pathology 7 is an in depth study of diseases of the respiratory system and cardiovascular system.

(1 credit) Pre-requisites: Anatomy/Physiology 4 & Pathology 1

Wednesdays 8:30am – 10:30am & 1:15pm – 3:15pm

January 6 to February 10

Pathology 8 (IAM/TCM) - Online

Pathology 8 is an in depth study of diseases of the cardiovascular system.

(1 credit) Pre-requisites: Anatomy/Physiology 4 & Pathology 1

Wednesdays 8:30am - 10:30am & 1:15pm - 3:15pm

February 17 to March 17

Courses - - Winter 2021 (January 3 – March 19)

Pharmacology (IAM/TCM/NHP/CEU) - Online

This course gives the student an understanding of the concepts and principles of pharmacology. The student will learn the different classification of medications, uses and effects. The student will also learn to research drug profiles and know how to read prescription labels. This course is designed to educate the student about drug therapy used as a treatment for a client's condition and how that drug therapy may help or hinder treatment.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Anatomy/Physiology 4 & Physiology 7

Thursdays 3:00pm – 5:15pm January 7 to March 18

Physiology 5 (IAM/TCM/NHP/CEU) - Online

Physiology 5 is the study of the human body on a chemical and cellular level. Also included are tissue types in the human body. It revisits the material covered during Anatomy/Physiology 1 and 2 and expands in greater depth in order to further the students' knowledge of the physiology of the human body.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Anatomy/Physiology 4

Mondays 3:15pm – 5:15pm January 4 to March 15

Physiology 8 (IAM/TCM/NHP/CEU) - Online

This course takes an in-depth look at the respiratory system of the human body. This course also further investigates the renal system, hormones, reproduction and the skin.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Physiology 7 **Wednesdays** 10:30am – 12:30pm

January 6 to March 17

Principles of Treatments & Advanced Techniques 1-4 (IAM) - Online & In-person

This course of study presents the theory of the principles of treatment for massage therapy. During this course the proper advanced techniques will be taught for treating acute and sub-acute injuries during these stages of healing. Students will learn to treat the following conditions in acute and sub-acute stage of injury: fracture, sprain, strain, tendonitis, tenosynovitis, bursitis, synovitis and contusion.

(4 credits) Pre-requisites: Massage Techniques 1 – 4 & Anatomy/Physiology 4

Tuesdays 10:30am – 12:00pm (Online) & Fridays 8:30am – 12:30pm & 1:15pm – 3:15pm (In-person)

January 5 to March 19

Point Location 2 (TCM) - Online

Point Location 2 provides students with the correct anatomical description of the location of each acupuncture point on the body. This is the second course in a 2 part series, each covering different meridians and acupuncture points. Point Location 2 covers the points along the kidney, pericardium, san jiao, gall bladder, liver, ren and DU meridians as well as extra points.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Meridian Theory 1

Tuesdays 8:00pm – 10:00pm

January 5 to March 16

Courses - - Winter 2021 (January 3 – March 19)

Point Functions 1 (TCM) - Online

The Point Functions courses examine different functions and uses in TCM point prescriptions to successfully improve patients' health. This first module explores points located on the lung, large intestine, stomach, spleen, heart, small intestine, and the bladder meridians.

(1 Credit) Pre-requisites: Point Location 1 and 2 (or in progress)

Tuesdays 8:30am - 10:30am

January 5 to March 16

Professionalism and the Healthcare Practitioner (IAM/TCM/NHP/CEU) - Online

As healthcare practitioners, the development of the skills and specific knowledge applicable to your principle health discipline remains a high priority, however, good character, personal and professional behaviors and practices, and work ethic have become vitally important to the overall health industry.

Health care is also a service business, yet for many this is a foreign concept. Patient and client satisfaction is necessary to the continuance in business as a professional.

(1/2 Credit) No pre-requisite

Mondays 10:30am - 12:30pm

February 22 to March 15

Reflexology 1 (NHP/CEU) - In-person

An introduction to the history, principles and theory of Reflexology, its benefits, its cautions, possible client reactions and what it does not do. The student also learns to see the foot as a reflection of the body.

R-1 looks at the zones of the foot and specific reflexes for the major organs and glands will be presented. Students will be introduced to the plantar and dorsal foot charts, and learn to identify the location of reflex points on the feet.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: IPAC Certificates Completion Mondays 7:00pm – 9:00pm January 11 to March 8 Saturdays 9:00am – 1:00pm February 13 & March 13

Remedial Exercise 2 (IAM) - Online

This course teaches principles of aerobic and resistance exercises. Once the principles are learned the student will be able to use them to develop an exercise program for the treatment of their massage client.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Remedial Exercise 1

Tuesdays 3:15pm – 5:15pm January 5 to March 16

Specialized Care (IAM) - Online

This course covers the proper skills and techniques required by a massage therapist to recognize and stay current on developments in areas requiring specialty care. Topics include concussion, PTSD, palliative and end of life care.

(0.75 credit) Pre-requisite: Treatments 1 or concurrently

Mondays 8:30am-10:30am January 4 to March 8 (9 weeks)

Courses - - Winter 2021 (January 3 – March 19)

Sports Massage (IAM) - Online

Learn specific treatments for stages of injury for various physical activities.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Principles of Treatments and Advanced Techniques 5 – 8

Thursdays 1:00pm – 3:00pm

January 7 to March 18

TCM Clinical Safety (Formerly, Clean Needles/Depths and Angles) - Online

By following the highest standards of acupuncture hygiene, this course will introduce techniques for safe, clean and effective needling.

(1 credit) Pre-requisites: Point Location 1 & 2 (or concurrently enrolled)

Tuesdays 6:00pm – 8:00pm

January 5 to March 16

Techniques of Acupuncture 1 (TCM) - In-person

Students learn basic treatment methods used in Chinese Medicine such as needling techniques and treatments, scalp acupuncture, and auricular acupuncture.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Point Locations 1 & 2, Clinical Safety, TCM Diagnosis & Treatments 1, Meridian Theory 1 & Theory Foundation 1 (or in progress)

Sundays 9:00am - 1:00pm, January 3, 10, 17, 24, 31 & 9:00am - 11:00am February 7

Techniques of Acupuncture 2 (TCM) - In-person

Students learn basic treatment methods used in Chinese Medicine such as cupping treatment, moxibustion (moxa), Gua Sha techniques, and electro acupuncture. This is theory and hands-on/practice lab class.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: TCM Diagnosis & Treatments 1, Meridian Theory 1, & Theory Foundation 1 (or in progress)

Sundays 11:00am - 1:00pm February 7 & 9:00am - 1:00pm, February 14, 21, 28, March 7, 14

Theory Foundations 1 (TCM/NHP/CEU) - Online

Learn the foundation of this 3000-year-old Chinese medicine, including Yin-Yang theory, the 5 elements, Qi, blood and all organ functions.

(1 credit) No Pre-requisite

Sundays 1:15pm – 5:15pm

January 17, 24, 31, February 7, 21, 28

Theory Foundations 2 (TCM/NHP/CEU) - Online

Students learn deeper meaning of theory in Traditional Chinese Medicine for purpose of better comprehension and application in diagnosing and treating patients.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Theory Foundations 1

Thursdays 8:30am – 10:30am

Treatments 1 (IAM) - Online & In-person

This course covers the proper skills and techniques required by a massage therapist to treat certain conditions, pathologies, illnesses and diseases. The student will study the causes, signs and symptoms, contraindications, testing, aims of treatment, and treatment of a clients' condition using massage therapy. The student will also review proper assessment tests and remedial exercises needed to treat their client.

The student will also review proper assessment tests and remedial exercises needed to treat their client. The content of Treatments 3 deals with conditions of the nervous system which include systematic conditions affecting the brain and spinal cord and nerve lesions.

(6 credits) Pre-requisite: Treatments 2


