To associate the theory educational points learned/being learned in Meridian Theory and TCM Foundations with the following: Yin & Yang in both excess and deficiency, clinical manifestation, assessment and treatment techniques, the 12 Zangfu Organ Systems in both harmony and disharmony and the 5 Element Theory as a clinical assessment tool.

Also to supplement acupressure treatments from levels 1 & 2 with the addition of Thai stretches, such as: leg stretches, knee bending, ankle stretches.


