Advanced Theory & O.S.C.E. Preparation (IAM) - In-person

Students undertake a thorough presentation and participation towards being prepared for the CMTO (OSCE) hands-on examination for future registration to become an RMT. In addition to the class sessions there is mock oral practical (schedule is TBA).

(2 credits) Pre-requisite: Complete Massage Therapy Semesters 1-5 Mondays 1:15pm - 5:15pm | January 9 – March 13

Anatomy 5 (IAM/TCM) - In-person

Anatomy 5 or Osteology is the study of the science of the structure and function of bone. This course takes an in-depth look into the human skeleton concentrating on the bones and bony landmarks of the body. (1 credit) Pre-requisite: Anatomy/Physiology 4 **Wednesdays** 3:15pm - 5:15pm | January 4 - March 15

Anatomy 8 (IAM/TCM) – In-person

This course discusses the digestive system and accessory organs of digestion in the human body. The urinary and reproductive systems will also be discussed. The end of the course provides an introduction to the nervous system.

(1 credit) No pre-requisite. Wednesdays 3:15pm - 5:15pm | January 4 – March 8

Client Assessment 2 (IAM) - In-person

This course is the beginning of regional assessment of the body, starting with the lower limb. (2 credits) Pre-requisites: Client Assessment 1, Anatomy/Physiology 4 **Mondays** 10:30am - 12:30pm, **and Tuesdays** 8:30am - 10:30am | January 3 - March 14

Client Assessment 4 (IAM) - In-person

This course focuses on palpation of the human body. Palpation's include all bony landmarks, muscles, tendons, ligaments, joints, pulse points, specific arteries and veins, specific lymph nodes, para-nasal sinuses and sensory nerve pathways.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Client Assessment 3.

Tuesdays 1:15pm - 5:15pm | January 3 - February 7

Client Assessment Lab 1 (IAM) - In-person

This assessment course will introduce the student to clinical assessment techniques such as taking case histories, and interviewing clients. Other topics discussed are assessing client pain, assessment responses and end-feels during physical examination. The student will also learn how

to assess gait and posture. Basic kinesiology is also included. The student will also be assessing the lower extremity using ROM, orthopedic and neurological tests.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Client Assessment 1

Tuesdays 10:30am - 12:30pm | January 3 - March 14

Client Assessment 4 Lab 2 (IAM) – In-person

This assessment course will introduce the student to clinical assessment techniques such as taking case histories, interviewing clients and the interview process. The student will be assessing the upper extremity and back using ROM, orthopedic and neurological tests.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Client Assessment 4.

Tuesdays 1:15pm - 5:15pm | February 14-March 14

Clinical Safety (TCM) - Online

By following the highest standards of acupuncture hygiene, this course will introduce techniques for safe, clean and effective needling.

(1 credit) Pre-requisites: Point Location 1 & 2 (or concurrently enrolled)

Mondays 7:05pm - 9:00pm | January 9 - March 13

Diagnosis & Treatments 1 (TCM) - Online

Students learn to assess and diagnosis patients via the TCM patterns of Yin-Yang, 5 elements and Organs using the 4 methods of diagnosis: palpation, observation, listening and hearing and inquiry. After completing this course, students will be able to begin to differentiate TCM patterns based on symptoms and assessment results.

(1 credit) No pre-requisite Mondays 5:00pm - 6:55pm | January 9 - March 13

Ethics & the Healthcare Practitioner (IAM/TCM) – In-person

The focus is on developing the student's ability to understand the role of a professional and the necessary commitment, by recognizing ethical issues encountered in their role, distinguishing between legal and ethical responsibilities, meeting the professional and ethical requirements of client care and personal conduct, and to develop a step by step skill in helping to make ethical decisions.

(0.5 credit) No pre-requisite

Thursdays 8:30am - 10:30am | January 5 - February 9

Gynecology 1 (TCM) - Online

Learn the acupuncture points for PMS, menopause, menstrual problems, infertility, postpartum and more. (1 credit) Pre-requisites:Meridian Theory 1, Diagnosis & Treatments 1, Point Locations 1-2 and Theory Foundations 1

Thursdays 7:00pm - 9:00pm | January 5 - March 16

Herbal Pharmacology -In-person & Online

This course will introduce students to the major classes of phytochemical constituents found in medicinal plants and how they interact with human physiology. Safety, toxicology and herb-drug interactions will be discussed.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Have at least one of the following course: Herbal Therapeutics 1, 2, Materia 1,2, or Western Herbal Energetics.

Online: Thursdays 6:00pm - 8:00pm |January 12, 19, 26, February 2, 16, 23, March 2 and 9 **In-person: Thursdays** 6:00pm - 8:00pm |January 5, February 9 and March 16

Internal Medicine 1 (TCM) - Online

Students learn to differentiate TCM patterns for disorders of the 4 Yin organs. Acupuncture point combinations for each pattern diagnosis are presented and discussed.

(1 credit) Pre-requisites:Diagnosis & Treatments 1, Meridian Theory 1, Point Locations 1-2 and Theory Foundations 1

Mondays 5:00pm -6:55pm | January 9 - March 13

Internal Medicine 3 (TCM) - Online

Students learn to differentiate TCM patterns for sexually transmitted diseases and proctology disorders as well as external skin disorders such as alopecia, herpes, lyme disease and scleroderma. Appropriate acupuncture point combinations for each pattern diagnosis are presented and discussed.

(1 credit) Pre-requisites: Diagnosis & Treatments 1, Meridian Theory 1, Point Locations 1-2 and Theory Foundations 1

Mondays 7:05pm - 9:00pm | January 9 - March 13

Iridology 1 (NHP/CEU) – Online

Learn the foundational principles of Iridology and its use as an assessment aid for natural health practitioners. (1 credit) No Pre-requisite, (Textbook required).

Tuesdays 6:30pm - 8:30pm | January 10 - March 7

Iridology 4 (NHP/CEU)

Students continue to explore Iridology with a look at the differences between the old and new teachings, Sclerology and the grading of a client's resiliency using shaded graphs. Continued evolution through Iridology: A Focused Study. Students will learn iridology constitutional types; how to recognize them, what they reveal and general health strategies for each type.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Iridology 3

Wednesdays 6:30pm - 8:30pm | January 11 - March 8

Modern Physical Diseases (TCM) - Online

To understand the symptoms and causes of physical disorders and what TCM may or may not be able to do. (1 credit) Pre-requisites:Diagnosis & Treatments 1, Meridian Theory 1, Point Locations 1-2 and Theory Foundations 1

Mondays 7:05pm - 9:00pm | January 9 - March 13

Myology 1 (IAM/NHP/CEU) - In-person

This course is an in-depth study of the muscles of the lower extremity, hip, leg, foot, gluteal region and anterior thorax. It discusses the origin, insertion, action and nerve supply of the muscles that move the lower limb.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Anatomy/Physiology 4 **Tuesdays** 1:15pm - 3:15pm | January 3- February 7 **Tuesdays** 1:15pm - 5:15pm | February 14- March 14

Myology 1 (TCM) - Online

A study of the relationship between the muscles and acupuncture points of the body. (1 Credit) Pre-requisite: Meridian Theory 1 **Tuesdays** 4:00pm - 5:55pm | January 3 - March 14

Myology 3 (IAM) - In-person

This course is an in-depth study of the muscles of the head, face and neck. Origin, insertion, action and nerve supply of the muscles that move the head and face and neck are discussed.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Myology 2

Mondays 3:15pm - 5:15pm | January 9 - March 13

Neuroscience 1 (IAM) – In-person

Neuroscience 1 is an in-depth examination of the nervous system. The physiology of the central nervous system and peripheral nervous systems are broken down in a detailed analysis of structure and function. The special senses are also included during this course of study.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Anatomy/Physiology 1-4

Wednesdays 1:15pm - 3:15pm | January 4 - March 15

Nutrition 1 (IAM) – In-person

This course provides an understanding of nutritional concepts. The ability to communicate effectively with your clients or other healthcare practitioners about basic nutritional elements and considerations, as well as the macro and micro nutrients.

(0.5 credit) No pre-requisite

Tuesdays 3:15pm - 5:15pm | January 3 - February 7

Nutrition 2 (NHP/CEU) - Online

This dynamic course guides you towards taking a positive approach to daily food requirements. Evolve your understanding of pH balance, food and non-fanatical healthy living. (1 credit) No Pre-requisite.

Thursdays 6:30pm – 8:30pm | January 5 - March 16

Off Site 1/Onsite Clinical 1 - Corporate Community (IAM) – In-person

This first clinical rotation is centered on corporate personnel to practice foundational massage therapy and build a student's hand skills. Students also learn how to perform a 15-minute chair massage and how to communicate with the general public. Massage therapy treatment is given to clients located onsite, with possible scheduled off-site sessions.

(2 credits) Pre-requisites: Massage Techniques 1-4 and Client Assessment 1 **Thursdays** 1:15pm - 5:15pm | January 5-March 16

Off Site 2/Onsite Clinical 2 - Geriatrics and Senior Care (IAM) – In-person

Students learn massage therapy treatments and techniques most beneficial for senior citizens. This subject may include off-site sessions in retirement facilities.

(2 credits) Pre-requisites: Anatomy/Physiology 1-4 & Massage Techniques 1-4 Wednesdays 1:15pm - 4:30pm | January 4 - March 15

On-Site Clinical Case Study 1 (IAM) – In-person

Each massage therapy student assesses a client, develops a treatment plan and then applies the treatment plan to the same client weekly throughout the semester. Students learn how to prepare a detailed progress report.

(2 credits) Pre-requisite: Program Director Approval **Thursdays** 1:15pm - 5:15pm | January 5-March 16

On-Site Clinical Case Study 2 (IAM) – In-person

Each senior massage therapy student assesses a client, develops a treatment plan and then applies the treatment plan to the same client weekly throughout the semester. Students then prepare a detailed progress report.

(2 credits) Pre-requisite: On-site Clinical Case Study 1 **Tuesdays** 1:15pm - 5:15pm | January 3 - March 7

Pathology 2 (IAM/TCM) –In-person

Pathology 2 is an in-depth study of diseases of the skin. (1 credit) Pre-requisites: Anatomy/Physiology 4 & Pathology 1 **Mondays** 8:30am - 10:30am and **Wednesdays** 10:30am - 12:30pm | January 4 - February 6

Pathology 3 (IAM/TCM) –In-person

Pathology 3 is an in-depth study of diseases of the joints and bones. (1 credit) Pre-requisites: Anatomy/Physiology 4, Pathology 1. **Mondays** 8:30am - 10:30am and **Wednesdays** 10:30am - 12:30pm | February 8 - March 15

Pathology 7 (IAM/TCM) - In-person

Pathology 7 is an in depth study of diseases of the respiratory system and cardiovascular system. (1 credit) Pre-requisites: Anatomy/Physiology 4 & Pathology 1 **Wednesdays** 8:30am - 10:30am, and 1:15pm - 3:15pm | January 4 - February 1

Pathology 8 (IAM) - In-person

Pathology 8 is an in depth study of diseases of the cardiovascular system. (1 credit) Pre-requisites: Anatomy/Physiology 4 & Pathology 1 Wednesdays 8:30am - 10:30am, and 1:15pm - 3:15pm | February 8 - March 8

Pathophysiology 2 (TCM) - Online

This course provides a brief overview of the etiology and pathogenesis of the conditions covering external medicine; gynecology; pediatrics; orthopedics and traumatology; ophthalmology and otorhinolaryngology from Appendix L of the Candidate's Guide for the Pan Canadian Examinations.

(1 credit) Pre-requisites: Diagnosis & Treatments 1, Meridian Theory 1, Point Locations 1-2, Theory Foundations 1 and Pathophysiology 1. Recommended: Modern Mental and Modern Physical Diseases. Students must request approval from the Program Director before enrolling in this course. **Mondays** 5:00pm - 6:55pm | January 9 - March 13

Pharmacology (IAM/TCM) – In-person

This course gives the student an understanding of the concepts and principles of pharmacology. The student will learn the different classification of medications, uses and effects. The student will also learn to research drug profiles and know how to read prescription labels. This course is designed to educate the student about drug therapy used as a treatment for a client's condition and how that drug therapy may help or hinder treatment.

(1 credit) Pre-requisites: Anatomy/Physiology 4 & Physiology 7 recommended. **Thursdays** 3:00pm - 5:15pm | January 5 -March 16

Physiology 5 (IAM/TCM) – In-person

Physiology 5 is the study of the human body on a chemical and cellular level. Also included are tissue types in the human body. It revisits the material covered during Anatomy/Physiology 1 and 2 and expands in greater depth in order to further the students' knowledge of the physiology of the human body.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Anatomy/Physiology 4

Wednesdays 8:30am - 10:30am | January 4 - March 15

Physiology 8 (IAM/TCM) – In-person

This course takes an in-depth look at the respiratory system of the human body. This course also further investigates the renal system, hormones, reproduction and the skin. (1 credit) Pre-requisite: Physiology 7 **Thursdays** 1:00pm - 3:00pm | January 5 -March 16

Point Functions 1 (TCM) - Online

Students further evolve their knowledge of acupuncture point functions and combinations. (1 credit) Pre-requisite: Point Location 2 **Tuesdays** 6:05pm - 7:55pm | January 3 - March 14

Point Functions 2 (TCM) - Online

The Point Functions courses examine different functions and uses in TCM point prescriptions to successfully improve patients' health. This second module explores point location, function and combination of the following meridians: Kidney, San Jiao, Pericardium, Gallbladder, Liver, Du & Ren (1 Credit) Pre-requisites: Meridian Theory 1, Theory Foundations 1, Point Locations 1, Point Locations 2 **Tuesdays** 8:05pm - 10:00pm | January 3 - March 14

Principles of Treatments & Advanced Techniques 1-4 (IAM) – In-person

This course of study presents the theory of the principles of treatment for massage therapy. During this course the proper advanced techniques will be taught for treating acute and sub-acute injuries during these stages of healing. Students will learn to treat the following conditions in acute and sub-acute stage of injury: fracture, sprain, strain, tendonitis, tenosynovitis, bursitis, synovitis and contusion. (4 credits) Pre-requisites: Massage Techniques 1 - 4 & Anatomy/Physiology 4 **Mondays** 1:15pm - 5:15pm and **Thursdays** 8:30am - 12:30pm | January 5 - March 16

Professionalism and the Healthcare Practitioner (IAM/TCM) – In-person

As healthcare practitioners, the development of the skills and specific knowledge applicable to your principle health discipline remains a high priority. However, good character, personal and professional behaviors and practices, and work ethic have become vitally important to the overall health industry.

Healthcare is also a service business, yet for many this is a foreign concept. Patient and client satisfaction is necessary to the continuance in business as a professional.

(0.5 credit) No pre-requisite

Thursdays 8:30am - 10:30am | February 16-March 16

Reflexology 1 (NHP) - Online & In-person

Reflexology 1 looks at the zones of the foot and specific reflexes for the major organs and glands will be presented. Students will be introduced to the plantar and dorsal foot charts, and learn to identify the location of reflex points on the feet.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: IPAC Certificates Completion

Online: Tuesdays 6:30pm - 9:30pm | January 10 and January 17 In-person: Saturdays 9:30am – 4:30pm | January 21 and February 4 1:30pm – 4:30pm | February 25 and March 4

Reflexology 2 (NHP/CEU) - Online & In-person

An introduction to the history, principles and theory of Reflexology, its benefits, its cautions, possible client reactions and what it does not do. The student also learns to see the foot as a reflection of the body.

R-1 looks at the zones of the foot and specific reflexes for the major organs and glands will be presented. Students will be introduced to the plantar and dorsal foot charts, and learn to identify the location of reflex points on the feet.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Reflexology 1, IPAC Certificates Completion Online: Tuesdays 6:30pm - 9:30pm | March 7, April 11 and 25 In-person: Saturdays 9:30am - 4:30pm | March 18, and April 22 1:30pm - 4:30pm | May 6

Reflexology 3 (NHP/CEU) - In-person

Further emphasis on the hand and reflex points of the face. Advanced techniques & referral points will be presented. Additionally, methods for treating lower back pain will be presented & discussed in detail. The operation of a clinic will also be discussed.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Reflexology 2

In-person: Saturdays 9:30am - 4:30pm | January 14, 28 and February 11

9:30am - 12:30 pm | February 25 and March 4

Reflexology 4 (NHP/CEU) - In-person

To identify conditions and treatments and the philosophy underlying the world of Reflexology, especially ear. (1 credit) Pre-requisite: Reflexology 3 **Online: Tuesdays** 6:30pm - 9:30pm | March 14, and 28 **In-person: Saturdays** 9:30am - 4:30pm | March 11, April 15 and 29

Remedial Exercise 2 (IAM) - In-person

This course teaches principles of aerobic and resistance exercises. Once the principles are learned the student will be able to use them to develop an exercise program for the treatment of their massage client. (1 credit) Pre-requisite: Remedial Exercise 1 Mondays 1:15pm - 3:15pm | January 9 - March 13

Specialized Care (IAM) - In-person

This course covers the proper skills and techniques required by a massage therapist to recognize and stay current on developments in areas requiring specialty care. Topics include concussion, PTSD, palliative and end of life care.

(0.75 credit) Pre-requisite: Treatments 1 or concurrently **Thursdays** 10:30am - 12:30pm | January 5 - March 2

Sports Massage (IAM) - In-person

Learn specific treatments for stages of injury for various physical activities. (1 credit) Pre-requisites: Principles of Treatments and Advanced Techniques 5 - 8 **Wednesdays** 10:30am - 12:30pm | January 4 - March 8

Techniques of Acupuncture 1 (TCM) – In-person

Students learn basic treatment methods used in Chinese Medicine such as needling techniques and treatments, scalp acupuncture, and auricular acupuncture.

(1 credit) Pre-requisite: Point Locations 1 & 2, Clinical Safety, TCM Diagnosis & Treatments 1, Meridian Theory 1 & Theory Foundation 1 (or in progress)

Sundays 9:00am - 1:00pm | January 8 – February 5

Techniques of Acupuncture 2 (TCM) – In-person

Students learn basic treatment methods used in Chinese Medicine such as cupping treatment, moxibustion (moxa), Gua Sha techniques, and electro acupuncture. This is theory and hands-on/practice lab class. (1 credit) Pre-requisites: TCM Diagnosis & Treatments 1, Meridian Theory 1, & Theory Foundation 1 (or in progress)

Sunday 1:30pm - 5:30pm | February 5 Sundays 9:00am - 1:00pm | February 12 - March 19

Treatments 1 (IAM) - In-person

This course covers the proper skills and techniques required by a massage therapist to treat certain conditions, pathologies, illnesses and diseases. The student will study the causes, signs and symptoms, contraindications, testing, aims of treatment, and treatment of a clients' condition using massage therapy. The student will also review proper assessment tests and remedial exercises needed to treat their client.

(6 credits) Pre-requisite: Principles of Treatments & Advanced Techniques 5 - 8

Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays 8:30am – 12:30pm | January 3 - March 15

Treatments 3 (IAM) –In-person

This course covers the proper skills and techniques required by a massage therapist to treat certain conditions, pathologies, illness and diseases. It is a continuation of Treatments 1 and 2. The student will study the causes, signs and symptoms, contraindication, testing, aims of treatment and treatments of a clients' condition using massage therapy. The student will also review proper assessment tests and remedial exercises needed to treat their client. The content of Treatments 3 deals with conditions of the nervous system which include systematic conditions affecting the brain and spinal cord and nerve lesions.

(6 credits) Pre-requisite: Treatments 2

Mondays, Tuesdays & Thursdays 8:30am - 12:30pm | January 3 - March 9

TuiNa 3 (TCM) – In-person

This is designed to expand the treatment techniques for both Acupressure & TuiNa to include treatments on the back, legs, knees, ankles, feet, face, head and neck. To associate the theory educational points learned/being learned in Meridian Theory and TCM Foundations with the following: Yin & Yang in both excess and deficiency, clinical manifestation, assessment and treatment techniques, the 12 Zangfu Organ Systems in both harmony and disharmony and the 5 Element Theory as a clinical assessment tool.

Also to supplement acupressure treatments from levels 1 & 2 with the addition of Thai stretches, such as: leg stretches, knee bending, ankle stretches.

(1 credit) Pre-requisites: Oriental Acupressure and TuiNa 2

Sundays 1:30pm - 5:30pm | January 8 - February 26.

No class on February 5th.

Western Herbal Energetics (NHP/CEU)

Deepen your understanding of plant medicine beyond "What is this plant good for?" Herbs shine when we move past treating the symptoms of disease and instead treat the person by matching them with the right plant. Using taste, herbal actions and thermal energetics provides a much more nuanced approach to herbalism. This practical, sensory-based, oganoleptic class will transform the way you use herbs! (1 credit) No pre-requisite.
